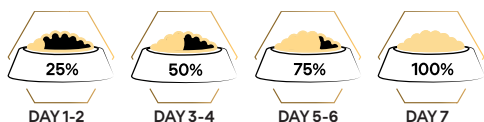

How to help:

In need of additional gut support?

Eating unusual items?

In an attempt to soothe their tummies, dogs may eat hazardous plants or objects, potentially worsening their condition.



Monitor your dog closely

Supervise your dog to prevent them from eating harmful or non-food items or plants and offer them safe chewing alternatives.

Less active than usual?

Digestive upsets can be physically draining and may result in lethargy or weakness.



Take it easy

Create a comfortable resting area for your dog to relax and recover in and encourage some light physical activity.

In need of additional hydration?

Loose stools can lead to a loss of water and electrolytes, potentially causing dehydration



Provide plenty of water

Make sure your dog always has access to fresh, clean water and consider providing a wet diet designed for easy digestion that will help firm up loose stools.
